Hi Greg,

I know the problem is that people see this when they initially open your installer:



I tried the little trick to open the Installer using the "Control-click; contextual menu Open" trick.



To get this dialogue:



But unfortunately, that didn't work. Perhaps it is because it needs Admin privileges to create the Bundles folder.

If you can get it to work that way, it would be the easiest for the users.

Anyways, I did get it to work with your installer, by going to the System Preferences > Security & Privacy and choosing to allow applications downloaded from "Anywhere".

I am releasing a new version of my MailFollowUp plugin. The update includes the following changes:

- Updated for Mac OS X 10.8.
- FIXED: Resolved issue with "Follow-Up Subject Prefix" not working.

This should work with 10.7 and Mail 5.0 or greater, including 10.8 and Mail 6.0. Intel machines only.
